

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

The following are frequently asked questions regarding grand jury service. If you find that you have a question that was not covered, please contact the jury staff by e-mail: jury@wawd.uscourts.gov or by phone at (206) 370-8410 or toll free at (800) 488-3550.

- Q: What is the primary difference between federal grand jury and federal petit jury (trial jury)?
- A: The petit jury listens to the evidence offered by the prosecution and the defense (if it chooses to offer any) during a criminal trial and returns a verdict of guilty or not guilty. The grand jury, on the other hand, does not determine guilt or innocence, but only whether there is probable cause to believe that a crime was committed and that a specific person or persons committed it. If the grand jury finds probable cause to exist, then it will return a written statement of the charges called an "indictment". Please read the enclosed grand jury handbook for a better understanding of this important civic duty.
- Q: Why is the term of service 18 months long?
- A: Because the nature of grand jury duty is to hear on-going investigations and testimony which can sometimes occur over several months, it is important that the same panel of grand jurors be available from beginning to end. Also, cohesiveness within the panel develops over time creating a more effective atmosphere during the grand jury proceedings.
- Q: I live over 60 miles away from the U.S. District Courthouse. Why was I selected to serve in Seattle?
- A: The Western District of Washington extends from the borders between Canada and Oregon to the crest of the Cascade Mountains and Washington coast. Grand jury proceedings involve criminal investigations in the district in which they are being held. The U.S. District Courthouse for this district is located in Seattle with a divisional office located in Tacoma. Grand jury proceedings are only held in the Seattle Courthouse. The Court must draw from the entire district in order to have a fair cross-section of the communities within the district.
- Q: What if I have a vacation or trip planned during a time that I'm serving?
- A: Grand jurors may be absent from sessions for vacations or other reasons depending upon the circumstances. All requests to miss a specific session should be made in writing and approved by the Court in advance.

- Q: If I live over 60 miles one-way from the Courthouse, may I stay overnight on the night before the impanelment?
- A: Yes. Whether you are reporting for the impanelment or selected to serve on the grand jury, you are entitled to stay the night prior to a day you are required by the Court to report. If you stay in the immediate Seattle area in a hotel, you are eligible to receive a flat rate of \$208.00 per night if a hotel receipt is provided for verification. If you choose to stay at a personal residence (friend/relative) in the Seattle area rather than a hotel, a partial subsistence fee of \$71.00 will be paid instead.
- Q: How long will I be there for the impanelment on
- A: Impanelments are usually completed by noon. There will be a brief orientation by the Assistant U.S. Attorney which may require you to be there until early afternoon if you are selected to the jury.
- Q: What are the first days that I will need to report for jury duty after impanelment?
- A: The first grand jury sessions will be held
- Q: If selected to serve, would I have to meet on days
- A: Not usually. Those sessions are set from the day you begin your term of service. Essentially, that you can plan out on your calendar to arrange your normal schedule around. The court will provide a schedule of grand jury reporting dates if you are selected as a juror.
- Q: Does the Court reimburse for toll, ferry and bus fare?
- A: The Court will reimburse for bridge tolls and round-trip ferry expenses but not for bus fare. While bus fare is not specifically paid, the 51 cents per mile paid for transportation expenses should cover the amount to take the bus. If not, please see a jury clerk when you report.
- Q: Does my employer have to continue to pay me while I'm serving?
- A: No. However, many employers have an employment policy in place regarding jury service. This policy should explain what an employer is willing or not willing to do in terms of paying employees while they are serving. Check with your employer to find out about their jury service policy.
- Q: What if it snows or adverse weather conditions prohibit me from being able to make it in time for a session? May I stay overnight prior to that day even if I don't live over 60 more from the Courthouse?
- A: Yes. Adverse weather conditions (e.g. snow, icy roads) may occasionally prohibit you from safely reporting to the courthouse on time for service. If you foresee a circumstance where this may occur, you must contact the jury staff as soon as possible. Do not report if it is unsafe to do so.
